# YouGlish activity - To be able to

#### **Student Worksheet**

#### Step 1 - Explanation

The word cluster *be able to* has many different soundshapes, we will look at six of them in this activity. In British English the Greenhouse form is *TO BE ABle TO* |tu: bi: eɪb.ºl tu:|, the Garden form is *tuh beyaybul tuh* |tə bi <sup>j</sup>eɪb.ºl tə|. (That's two soundshapes so far). But there are many of other sound shapes, four of which are: *to be ebble to, to be aboo to, to be al to* and *to be ell to*. (That makes six soundshapes).

### Step 2 - Warm up

Practice saying these different sound shapes of *to be able to* using the speech unit below, replacing the underlined words with the different soundshapes listed above. Get faster and faster.
