

# Listening-decoding in Use – 3 – Polarisk







### 3.1Polarisk

A polarisk is a moment in the sound substance of speech where it (the sound substance) is so mushy that it not clear whether the speaker intends positive or negative polarity – there is a risk that the listener may hear the unintended polarity. For example, the sound substance may contain mush that can be heard as both *can* and *can't* or *and fortunately* and *unfortunately*.

In these circumstances polarity is at risk - therefore polarisk.
